## **Faces / Places** PG



Steven Spielberg directs Meryl Streep and Tom Hanks in this thrilling drama in which The Washington Post races to keep up with The New York Times to expose the massive cover up of government secrets that spanned three decades and four US Presidents, exposed in the “Pentagon Papers”. **Stan & Ollie** PG



**Still Alice** 12A


